Board Approves Reserve Study

The repainting of our homes & repaving of our streets are two very expensive projects being planned for over the next several years. With that in mind, our Board of Directors wanted to have a new, updated, professionally done Reserve Study to better understand with more confidence whether we are on track to have enough monies in that Reserve 'savings' Fund to cover both of these upcoming projects when that time comes.

So, at its September 20th meeting, the Board of Directors awarded Association Reserve Inc. a contract to perform an updated Reserve Study of our community. Their engineers should begin conducting inspections of the community's infrastructure in October and it should take them about 4-6 weeks to complete their study.

A new table along with an umbrella and accompanying benches was purchased and has now been installed at the Children's Playground for parents use while their children are enjoying the playground. An outdoor wi-fi signal is available for resident's use when sitting at the table.

Upon recommendation by the Facilities Committee, the Board vot-

ed at their September 20th meeting to accept a proposal from Busy Body Gyms to replace some of the outdated exercise equipment in the Clubhouse Gym. Some of the original equipment is more than 15 years old and one of the concerns is that parts for the repair of those equipment pieces are no longer even manufactured. Nine single-function exercise machines will be replaced with six multi-function machines freeing up space for the possible future addition of three additional function machines.



This month I'll bring everyone up to date on community projects both past and present. The Board's been busy approving many with the intent of maintaining and enhancing our community. Our community is now 20 years old with the HOA's Articles of Incorporation having been filed on April 7th, 2003.

Over the years things tend to wear out and need repair or replacement and this is also true with our buildings, equipment and facilities. An example is the lap pool heaters, originally installed in 2009. These needed replacement because they were old and no longer working properly, so new GeoThermal heat/cool units were installed to replace them. When these types of problems are identified we try to get them fixed as soon as possible. But, sometimes we must wait for parts that are on backorder, which will cause repair delays. Know that we're always looking for cost appropriate ways for purchasing new equipment as well as needed repairs.

We've also seen the need to make improvements and updates to our facilities. We've improved the playing area of our Bocce and Shuffleboard courts by adding pavers in the approach areas to allow for more seating, eliminating chairs on the lawn. Another improvement was the enhanced Wi-Fi to the outdoor and recreational areas behind the Clubhouse.

One project pending is the painting of homes. A survey is being sent out to all homeowners asking if they would be in favor of adding additional colors to the repainting palette or whether they prefer to keep colors as they currently are. Another in the works project is updating lighting at the Pickleball, Tennis and Basketball courts to LED. I'll keep you updated as more information becomes available.

When Did America First Celebrate Halloween?

It is widely believed that many of Halloween's traditions evolved from an ancient Celtic pagan festival named Samhain, which was then Christianized by the early church with All Hollow's Eve being a vigil to the Christian All Hollow's Day.

All Hollow's Day was celebrated to honor all of their many Christian Saints and to offer prayers for the souls of the recently departed.

Celebrated in Ireland and Scotland for centuries, "guising" would be a traditional All Hollow's Eve custom (poor children in disguise carrying lanterns made of hollowed out turnips going door to door looking for food or coins in exchange for praying for the dead).

The idea of celebrating Halloween (All Hollow's Eve) was then brought to America by Irish and Scot-

tish immigrants who were escaping the great potato famine of the middle 19th century. They began using pumpkins for their lanterns as pumpkins were found to be more prevalent here than turnips were, while still easy to scoop out and make into a lantern.



While the first reference in America to "guising" was in 1911, the first known reference to "trick or treating" wasn't until 1935. After becoming popular here, the idea of celebrating Halloween then began to spread to Central and then to South America.

Birds of The Lakes

Blue Heron

The Blue Heron is the largest heron species in North America. Notable features include slatey colored feathers (gray with a distinct bluish hue) and a dull yellowish-orange colored beak. A pair of distinct black plumes extend from behind the eye to the back of the head. Feathers hanging down from the neck are also long and plume like.

If you see one at water's edge, it is most likely fishing. They will fish in shallow water of 20" or less, often standing there motionless for up to 10 minutes waiting patiently for a fish to swim by. Upon seeing prey, they will strike it with their dagger-like bill and usually swallow it whole, always head first so it goes down easier.

They have been known to choke on prey that turned out to be too large for them to swallow whole.

The female lays 3-6 blue colored eggs at two day intervals. The eggs hatch 27 days later over a several days period of time. Both parents will feed their young while in the nest by regurgitating what they have eaten. At about the 80 day mark, the young will take their first flight from the nest.

Adult herons have few natural predators and are rarely preyed upon due to their large size and sharp dagger-like bill. If attacked, they can put up a very good fight. In one known attack from an eagle, the heron was able to mortally wound the eagle. At night, herons exhibit a habit that might surprise you: they sleep in trees as some protection against being surprised by a possible predator.


