

Facilities Committee Has Been Busy In 2023 By Greg Snider

Your Facilities Committee was very busy during 2023 with many projects that were completed successfully to make our community even better.

The largest project was to replace the costly-to-maintain Metal Halide light fixtures in the various ball courts over to a more cost-effective LED light source, which also increased the amount of light over all the court surfaces. New LED lighting was also installed to improve lighting in the parking lots.

Wi-Fi coverage was improved to also cover all outdoor areas around the Clubhouse. A shade table and benches were added to the Children's Playground to provide more comfort to those using it.

We've undergone a replacement of Gym equipment by removing nine machines and replacing them with six dual purpose machines. This will eliminate issues with hard-tofind replacement parts and free up space for adding different purpose machines in the future.

The Bocce Court area was improved with replacement of sideboards and pavers to the approach areas to increase seating. A seldom used Shuffleboard court was resurfaced and pavers added to provide seating area for a now popular activity.

Thanks to our committee members for these achievements: Gene Wesnofske, Stan Briggs, Roy Perconte, Rich Mancinelli, guidance from Tom Klein and our Board Liaison, Ken Perlman.

Well, the holiday season has come and gone. I hope everyone enjoyed and shared the holiday celebrations with their families and friends. The New Year is now upon us and most of our seasonal residents have returned. I would like to extend a warm welcome to them.

The annual Budget Meeting was held November 28th. The 2024 budget was presented to homeowners and approved unanimously by the Board. The Board takes its fiduciary responsibility very seriously in managing the finances of the Association.

An important note: The Reserve Study was last done in 2017 so the Board took the necessary action to make sure a new and current reserve study was done this year. It's very important to have reserve studies which provide a current estimate of the costs of repairing and replacing major common area components (such as roofs or pavements) over the long term. Ideally, all major repair or replacement costs will be covered by funds set aside by the Association as reserves so that funds are available when needed. As everyone knows the cost of living has gone up, especially in dealing with insurance. Most Homeowners Associations had to increase their monthly and/or quarterly assessments (some up to 20%). Fortunately, we've not had to do this. The Board is proud to announce that our quarterly assessment has only been increased by approximately 1.4% in 2024 (Capris - \$11, Oakmonts - \$12 and Carlyles - \$14.

As the new year has begun, we have still many things to look forward to and many things to take into consideration to improve our beautiful community. As always, we've listened to suggestions from homeowners and have responded to them. But, it's up to you as a member of this Association to attend meetings, voice your opinions and participate in the exchange of ideas with the Board. In community associations, each Board member is considered a fiduciary and is duty-bound to act in the best interests of all residents. We encourage your participation. Perhaps you would consider volunteering and/or attending committee meetings.

I wish *all* our homeowners a very Happy, Healthy and Prosperous New Year.

Our Favorite Recipes

Diane Corwin's Ricotta Cake

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and grease a 9"x13" Pyrex glass pan.

- 1 box yellow cake mix
- 2 lbs. ricotta cheese
- 4 eggs
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract

Mix cake mix as directed on box. Pour into 9"x13" pan. In a separate bowl, mix ricotta, eggs, sugar, and vanilla. Spread ricotta mixture on top of cake batter.

Bake at 350 degrees for 50 minutes. Shut off the oven and let the cake sit for 10-15 minutes. Ricotta will sink to the bottom of the pan and the cake will rise to the top around ricotta. Remove from oven & sprinkle cooled cake with powdered sugar.

Our county Preserves have provided me with wonderful hiking experiences since my arrival here in 2015. I have hiked many of the 26 Preserves located here in St. Lucie County and have quite a few favorites including Oxbow, Ancient Oaks and Ten Mile Creek.

I will hike alone and/or with friends but I prefer to participate in the Guided Nature Programs or the Guided Kayak Tours sponsored by St. Lucie County's Environmental Resources Department (ERD). These tours are led by skilled hiking guides who are enthusiastic and knowledgeable. Each program features a unique topic such as native plants, restoration projects, invasive species, wildflowers, birds, etc. I enjoy night hikes where we watch the sunset, moon rises, owls, and other nocturnals. Their programs run from October to June. To sign up go to: *slchikes.org* It's a great way to get into nature; *plus...*the hikes are FREE!!!



The ERD manages over 11,000 acres of protected land with 26 Preserves that are open to the public. Their Significant Lands Program began in 1994 with the passage of a \$20 million local bond program with the mission to preserve, protect and restore ecosystems in their natural state while providing compatible public usage.

Monies in the bond program have more than tripled because ERD continues to receive grants. Lands are acquired with the assistance of Florida Communities Trust (FCT), South Florida Water Management District, Save Our Rivers and Conservation And Recreational Lands (CARL). The bond will expire in 2024. Hopefully, there will be another bond of some sort going on the ballot in November of 2024 to replace it, so ERD can continue to acquire more land for conservation and can continue to protect our natural resources. Hoping to see you on the trail!



These machines allow you to switch between two different exercises with a simple quick adjustment. Placards on each give you visual instructions showing how each machine works & what muscle it exercises.
